### OFFICE OF FAITH FORMATION

- Assist coordinators for the various faces and forms of evangelization and catechesis in the diocese to develop curriculum and programs that engages and embraces our Catholic faith and assists families in their growth and witnessing as Catholics
- Encourage and support parishes in the formation of all members but especially those who form others through the Franciscan at Home Catechetical Institute and the Faith Formation Day.
- Provide guidelines and assist parishes with sacramental catechesis for Baptism, First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion and Confirmation, and, Coordinate Adult Confirmation at the Cathedral and Co-Cathedral
- Assist parishes with implementing the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults including adaptation for children/youth and coordinate Diocesan wide celebrations of the Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion
- Coordinate the Circle of Grace program to assist schools and parishes for presentation to the children/youth on keeping safe from abuse and maintain records of sessions in keeping with the Charter for the Protection of Children/Youth for the Diocesan Audit.
- Co-direct the Lay Formation Institute for adults seeking to grow in their vocations as lay men and women in the world.
- Support, assist and publicize the regional young adult ministry and coordinate the team for diocesan wide events.
- Assist parishes in developing the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd program, coordinating the formation of the catechists, and support parish coordinators.

#### OFFICE OF YOUTH MINISTRY

- Middle School Retreats Offered in the fall and spring, these retreats give middle school youth new experiences to grow closer to the Lord and grow in their faith. They also meet other Catholic youth and realize they are part of a larger faith community.
- Annual Diocesan Youth Conference Is an opportunity for high school youth to encounter the Lord in a new way and grow stronger in their faith. This one-day event includes prayer, inspirational national speakers, the sacraments and new friends!
- High School Camp Out Campout brings together Catholic youth from the diocese and includes time to enjoy God's awesome creation, prayer and the sacraments, and fellowship with youth from other Catholic parishes.
- Christian Leadership Institute This is a four-day formation for young people who desire to live as disciples and take a more active role in the church. With this emphasis on evangelization and discipleship, young people will learn to share with others how God is working in their lives.
- Religious Emblems Programs for American Heritage Girls, Trail Life, Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts
- Provides support, formation and resources for adults working with youth.

#### OFFICE OF THE DIACONATE

- Supports the personal, spiritual and ministerial growth of the deacons and their wives.
- Provides continuing education opportunities to the diaconal community.
- Develops, modifies and implements the Permanent Deacon Formation Program, to ensure an increasing and vibrant community.

#### OFFICE OF MARRIAGE AND FAMILY LIFE

- Coordinate and deliver marriage preparation days with focus on proclaiming Jesus Christ as the author and center of married life
- Plan and deliver the annual Diocesan Marriage Retreat
- Coordinate annual Jubilee Mass celebrations honoring couples celebrating milestone wedding anniversaries
- Co-direct the Lay Formation Institute for adults seeking to grow in their vocations as lav men and women in the world
- Assist parishes upon request in developing comprehensive plans for sacramental marriage formation
- Support and promote parish based marriage enrichment efforts such as Adventures in Marriage, Domestic Church Families and Renovación Conyugal
- Assist clergy in their efforts to connect couples in need with quality, faith based marriage counselors throughout our diocese
- Increase fertility awareness from a Catholic perspective through the development of diocesan sponsored Introduction to Natural Family Planning course
- Alongside Faith Formation and Youth Ministry offices, provide support for Catholic parents educating their children through Enkindling the Flame of Faith video series
- Deliver presentations for parishes and ministries on various theological topics impacting marriage and family life
- Assisting parishes in their efforts to connect individuals experiencing distress or bereavement in family situations with helpful programs

#### CATHOLIC CHARITIES OF NORTHWEST FLORIDA

- For more than 94 years, Catholic Charities of Northwest Florida has been carrying out the social mission of the Catholic Church in 18 counties across Northwest Florida. They serve, empower, and advocate for our poor and vulnerable neighbors of any race, religion, or national origin. They "provide help, create hope, and serve all."
- Emergency Assistance: The Emergency Assistance program provides critical assistance for individuals and families experiencing a crisis so that their basic needs are met. Financial assistance can support needs such as housing, utilities, and lifesustaining medication. Our case managers validate and verify the need that has been identified. Once the financial assistance is approved, they pay the vendor directly, such as the landlord or utility company. They also provide financial literacy training for individuals who receive help.
- Food Assistance: Food assistance is provided to individuals and families who are struggling to provide food for their families. This assistance is provided through their local Food Pantries. The Caring Coach, a mobile food pantry, is an outreach food assistance program that takes food and support to rural areas for individuals and families to be able to have access to healthy and nutritious food.
- Disaster Relief and Recovery: When a disaster such as a hurricane impacts our neighbors, Catholic Charities provides relief for those impacted with basic needs and assists individuals with their recovery as they rebuild their lives after a disaster.
- Immigration & Refugee: Immigration and Refugee services provide legal services for family-based immigration cases. They provide a legal route to citizenship to qualified immigrants and refugees seeking liberty and freedom. They provide an affordable way for individuals to become a legal citizen and can assist all nationalities.
- Christmas Connection: Christmas Connection is a holiday assistance outreach program for individuals and families who are struggling by fulfilling their basic needs and holiday wishes to brighten their holidays. Wishes are filled through an application process or by an agency referral.
- Pregnancy & Adoption: Pregnancy and Adoption services protect
  the dignity of women and the lives of unborn children by providing
  counseling, support, and resources to women overwhelmed by
  an unplanned pregnancy. Birth mothers are offered the option
  to place their children with a forever family. They also provide
  adoptive families support and can assist with providing nonidentifying information and /or reunions to members of the
  adoption triad.
- Maithew's Nursery: Matthew's Nursery is a referral-based program that provides parents of infants, up to one year of age, with items such as wipes, diapers, and other baby needs. This program serves the tiniest of our vulnerable neighbors.
- Saint Barnabas House: The Saint Barnabas House is a three to six-month transitional living/work program in Panama City. The program strengthens families by providing safe housing to those who are homeless. The Saint Barnabas House assists individuals in achieving self-sufficiency and independence through education and support in an atmosphere of dignity and respect.
- Pregnancy & Patenting Support A new ministry helping new and expectant mothers through education, support, and supplies to moms and their families free of charge.
