

Statement from Bishop-Elect Bill Wack, CSC

I am incredibly humbled by the Holy Father's appointment to serve the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee as bishop. Now I know for sure that God is merciful, having called this sinner to serve in this capacity.
